The [Cultural Data Survey on Images of Germany in Greece During the Great War](#) is an ongoing survey collecting information and data about cultural activities and cultural materials depicting the images of Germany in Greece, along with various aspects of the Greek-German relations during the period of the First World War. The survey is part of the research project [“Images of Germany in Greece During the Great War: Discourses, Perceptions, and Propaganda, 1914-1918”](#) (2020-present) that is implemented by the [Institute for the Study of Greek-German Relations](#) of the Department of Political Science and Public Administration (National and Kapodistrian University of Athens), in cooperation with the [Center for Modern Greece](#) (Centrum Modernes Griechenland/CeMoG) of the Freie Universität Berlin (FU Berlin).
